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This book covers the thirty five chapters of First and Second Corinthians and Galatians. Like all the others in the Douthitt series, these studies are designed to send the student to the original source, the Bible, for the answers; because a knowledge of the *Bible* can never be acquired except by a study of the *Bible*.

Many teachers of Bible classes know the value of an outline that will guide the student into a knowledge of just what the word of God says, rather than what men have said on religious issues; that will make the student happy in the study of God's word; increase interest and attendance; show the results of private study; give the student an opportunity to express himself; cause the student to feel that something is expected of him.
