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FOREWORD

The Book of Revelation has been abused and neglected perhaps as no other book of the Bible. Some have urged their speculative theories and contradictory views with no small degree of dogmatism. Others have neglected the study of the book on the unwarranted assumption that there is no practical value in it. Both of these attitudes are contrary to plain and positive statements of the Lord.

It is "the Revelation of Jesus Christ"; it is from God (Rev. 1: 1). Therefore, it is sinful to neglect the study of it.

A solemn warning is given lest any one should add to or take from the words of the Book of Revelation (Rev. 22: 18, 19). Therefore, it is dangerous to mutilate or tamper with its teaching.

Blessings are promised to those who read and hear and keep the things written in the Revelation (Rev. 1: 3). Therefore, the book is of spiritual profit and practical value.

The purpose of these twenty-six lessons is to help the student acquire a knowledge of what the book actually says. What men have said about the Revelation is of little or no importance. But what the book itself says is of the greatest significance.

These studies contain no speculation, and they give no encouragement to the "interpretation" of symbolic and prophetic utterances which the Lord himself did not reveal; they are a definite warning against such.
